Mr. Blankenship passed away on Friday, January 6, 2017 at his residence. He was born on May 23, 1932 in Alexander City, Alabama to Vester Blankenship and P Y Smith Blankenship. He was a member of First Baptist Church and Ware Masonic Lodge and was a 50 year Mason. Mr. Blankenship was an excellent wood craftsman and built furniture for his children and grandchildren and built his own home 56 years ago. He served as a Staff Sergeant in the Alabama National Guard Towed Artillery. Mr. Bill enjoyed fishing, especially with his friend, Larry Collins.

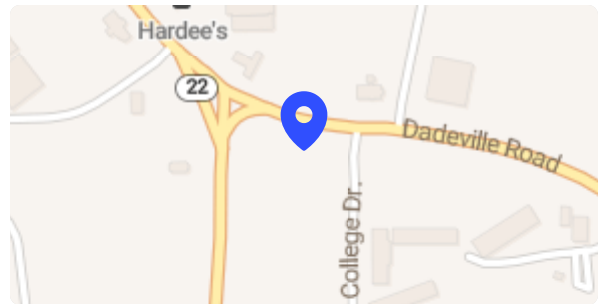

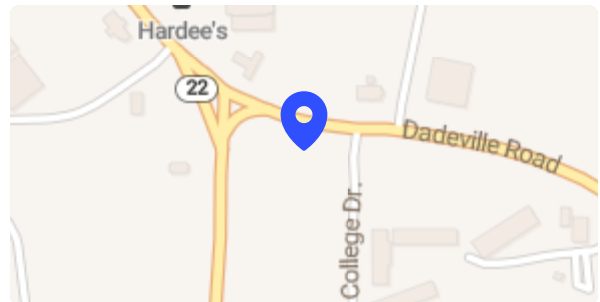
