Funeral Service for Rev. Kenneth Ray Neeley, 82, of Alexander City, Alabama, will be Sunday, March 2, 2025 at 2:00 pm at the Orr Street Baptist Church. Rev. Kenneth Neeley will lie in state one hour prior to the service at the church. Rev. Bruce Willis, Dr. Albert Pike, Rev. David Grier will officiate. Burial will follow in the Hillview Memorial Park. The family will receive friends on Saturday, March 1, 2025 from 5:00 pm to 8:00 pm at Radney Funeral Home.

Mr. Neeley passed away on Wednesday, February 26, 2025 at his residence surrounded by his loving family enjoying his favorite hymns and praising God as he was eternally healed. 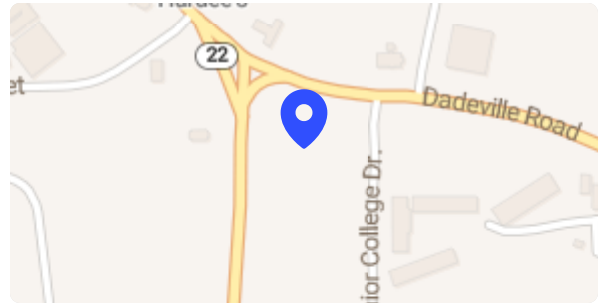

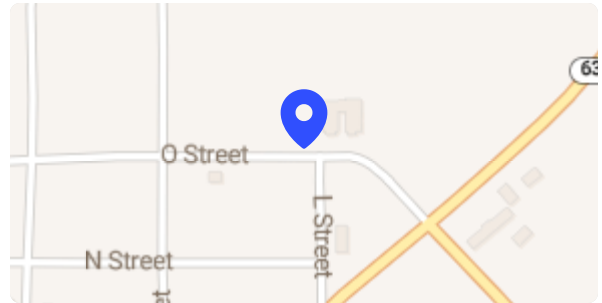

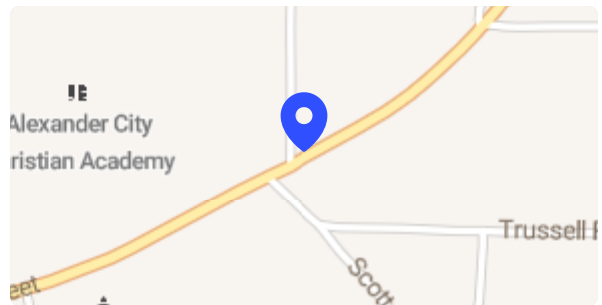
