She passed away on September 20, 2025 in Montgomery, Alabama. She was preceded in her death by her parents. She is survived by her sister Mrs. Betty Sides (Charles deceased), her brothers, Dr. William Queen (Beverly deceased) and Richard Queen (Jan); nephews, Keith Sides, Brad Queen, Rich Queen, Jeff Queen, David Reid; nieces, Katherine Queen, Jackie Yongue, Rebecca Hunter; great nephews Trey Sides, David Sides; great niece Katie Sides, Samantha Queen, Lucy Queen and Alice Queen. She retired as Coordinator of Special Education programs in Alexander City. In the summer of 1956, she worked on the staff of Ridgecrest Baptist Assembly in Ridgecrest, North Carolina. During several summer vacations, she helped build churches in various states.

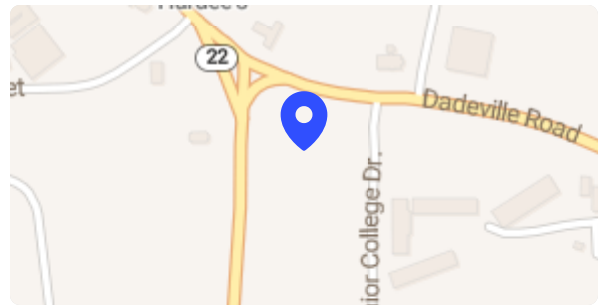

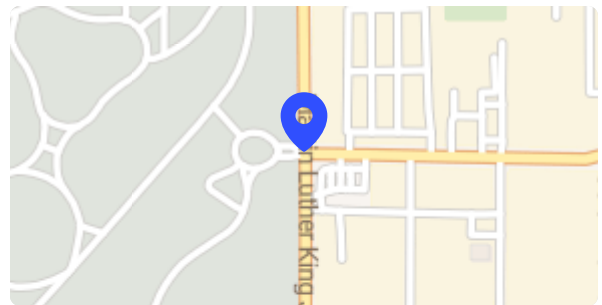

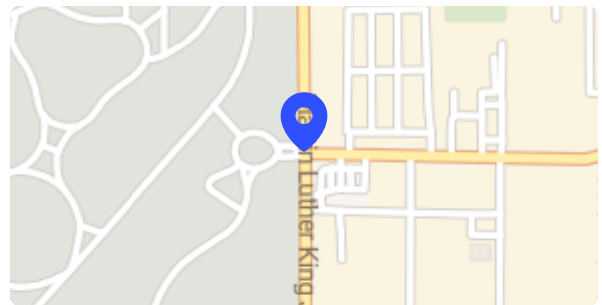
