Her spirit, a blend of tenderness and strength, will forever be a guiding light for her family and all who were blessed to know her.






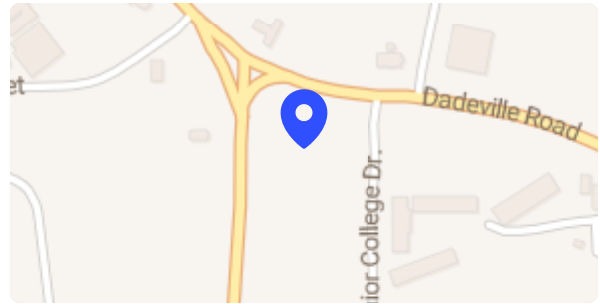
